For who?

- Children and youth up to 20 years old who have come to Sweden unaccompanied and who, due to a variety of reasons, do not receive services offered by the State, and who frequently are no longer entitled to help and care from the society.
- Children who may have run away from their placement within the social services, they may not have applied for asylum in Sweden or their asylum claim may have been denied (or they are afraid of being denied) and in response they have chosen to hide in Sweden. .

- In 1 of June 2016 the Swedish government change the legislation which governs the support (daily allowance) given to asylum seeker by the Swedish Migrations Agency.
- We can see that the result of the new legislation is that youths are forced out on the streets.

How?

- Outreach activities in co-operation with different networks in order to establish contact with the target group.
- Offer anonymous and safe meeting places.
- Supportive talks, social interaction, activities.
- Provide basic needs (food/clothes/hygiene).
- Help the participants get in contact with, for example, health care, lawyers, social services.
- Advocate– we can represent the participants if he/she request it, together with the participant we explore different alternatives.
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Objectives

- To improve possibilities for the youth to reach more durable solutions and that they should participate in the process.
- The youth should be able to document and share their stories and get better knowledge about human rights, the asylum process and and current legislation.
- Create an modell on how to work restoratively with the target group in the context of individual circumstances.

Do not see any possibility to return

- One has established oneself in Sweden – crisis when asylum claim denied
- Sexual orientation
- Responsibility for family
- Religion
- War and conflict
- Has grown up as undocumented refugee outside native country
